Inclusive education

- Inclusive education has been shown to be the best method for educating children with disabilities, rather than segregating them into special schools or classes.
- Inclusive education is a low-cost investment with high returns.
- Inclusive education requires more teacher training and additional need-specific support and resources.
- Only 10% of countries have laws supporting full inclusion in education.
- When people with disabilities receive higher levels of education, their household will be less likely to live in poverty.
- Building schools with accessibility features is more cost effective than adding them later.

Social change

- Higher education increases a person's social mobility and their chances of escaping poverty.
- Education promotes social mobility by giving people skills that allow them to get better and more secure work.
- Increasing educational opportunity for the most disadvantaged is an efficient way to reduce poverty, inequality, and improve social mobility, all critical to long-term economic growth.
- Education systems have the potential to engage in social transformation as agents of change.

Jobs and skills

• Closing the skills gap unleashes economic potential. If education systems successfully address the skills gap for the future of work, as much as US\$11.5 trillion can be added to global GDP by 2028.





Equity

- Education has the power to promote a more equal and just society.
- Education has a tremendous power to equalise the playing field early in life and helps reduce inequalities between income groups and for minority populations.
- Education can create more equitable societies, if investments provide opportunities to the poorest and most marginalised.
- Marginalised children in rich and poor countries are less likely to have access to quality early childhood education.
- An equitable education system provides economic opportunity for all, laying the foundation for a peaceful, productive and fair society.
