The research questions below can help teachers to formulate assignments and also support students with other types of project work, both inside and outside of the classroom.

- Why should host countries invest in refugee education?
- Why is it important to ensure that refugees and migrant populations can access quality education?
- What education practices can deliver benefits to refugees and the most marginalised?
- What barriers to education do migrant children face?
- What are the benefits to educating refugees and migrant populations?
- What is the relationship between education and child labour?
- How can technology improve access to quality education for those most marginalised, refugees, and migrant populations?
- How can technology help to deliver education in times of emergency or unprecedented situations?

These clear topic statements help students to express their opinion and can form the basis of their argument in essay responses or other projects.

- Investing in education for refugees provides hope and opportunity for children who have experienced unthinkable tragedy and disruption to their lives.
- Supporting refugee education can help to improve education for host communities.
- Refugee education creates more tolerant, peaceful societies and helps ensure people are able to contribute to their host communities and be prepared to return home and rebuild their communities.
